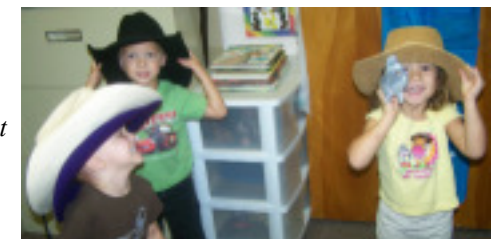
## Call For Volunteers!


